

Kansas Rose-Machine Appliqué

Wow, this is a fun project. You will be amazed how easy it is to get smooth curves and sharp points as you machine appliqué using an invisible stitch. This project also includes reverse appliqué and a fabric overlay for some added excitement. Come spend a fun packed six hours and learn lots of tips and tricks.

SUPPLIES

- Rotary cutter, board and ruler
- Sewing machine in good working order
- Open embroidery foot for your machine
- Fabric markers
- Needle for hand sewing (just a little)
- 60/8 microtex needles
- 80/12 machine needles
- Thread-50/3 cotton in neutral color
- Thread-A very fine clear nylon, monofilament or polyester thread
- Fabric glue stick-(I like Avery glue pens from the office supply store-(Staples)-but any water soluble glue will do the job)
- Either a zipper foot or a top or edge stitching foot for your machine (I recommend you bring all the feet you have and we'll determine which ones work the best.)
- Fine grain piece of sand paper or a sand paper board
- Iron and pressing board
- Staple and staple remover
- Scissors for paper and fabric
- Pencil
- Fine, thin pins
- Tape
- Freezer paper square cut 12 1/2" and a scrap about 3"x8"
- Fine point felt tipped marker (to mark paper)
- Emery board

FABRIC

- 14" square of background fabric
- 14" square of fabric overlay (around the outside edge of the block)
- Scraps or 1/8 yard pieces for stems and leaves
- Five or six scraps or 1/8 yard pieces for remaining flower shapes
